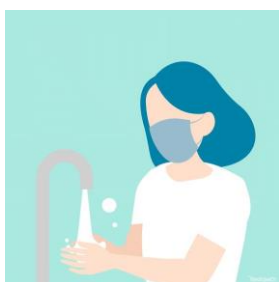

My husband bought it for me as a surprise when I first started quilting. It has stitched every quilt I have ever made and almost 200 masks. It was a workhorse and gallantly spent its final days sewing masks for our community. I am writing about the sad end to my machine as a reminder to all that after these many months of sewing while sheltering in place your machines will probably appreciate a visit to your service provider for a good cleaning and oiling.

Things are finally beginning to open up and as we begin to venture out (as I had to do to pick up my new sewing machine), I hope you are all staying safe and continue to practice the steps to prevent infection and to slow transmission of COVID-19. We have all heard them many, many times:
